I will remain fairly busy with Delegate tasks for several more weeks: I will be visiting District 6, November 19, to share about Area service. I have also received a request from the North Florida A.A. Delegate that came in through the Al-Anon World Service Office (WSO), to have our Area work on an Archives display project in 2012 in cooperation with North Florida A.A. No later than December 1st, I will be submitting an Area bid to host the 2018 Al-Anon International Convention. All bid submissions from Areas will then be reviewed after the close of the 2012 World Service Conference. By December 18th, the incoming Delegate Terry K. and I will also be submitting a Chosen Agenda Item (CAI) for consideration for the 2012 World Service Conference (WSC). And, last but not least,

Terry K. and I will also soon be making our travel arrangements and preparing to attend the Southeast Regional Delegates' Get-Together (SERDGT) in Raleigh, NC, February 3-5, 2012, I as the outgoing Delegate, and he as the incoming Delegate.

PUBLIC OUTREACH WEBSITE

Hopefully you have been informed of and visited the new version of the Public Outreach website at www.al-anon.org. "The updated Web site offers a much wider range of resources and tools to newcomers as well as to AI-Anon members engaged in public outreach." "The new Web site also includes sections that provide resources to professionals and members of the media who want to learn more about AI-Anon." And, you can also access the Members' Web site through the Public Outreach Website.

Members Website:

Some current information on the Members' Web site includes:

On-line sharing for *The Forum*, on-line sharing for *Humor in The Forum*, on-line sharing for *AI-Anon Faces Alcoholism*, and on-line sharing for the new piece, *Intimacy In Alcoholic Relationships* (working title). There is also a sharing sheet that can be downloaded for sharing in *The Forum* and an Intimacy sharing sheet.

The Unlimited Abundant Resources Skills Inventory is still available on the Members' Web site on the surveys page, and on the Publications link, you will find a page named Newsletters, which now is the only location you may get the *Area Highlights* newsletter published by WSO.

G-8 –The "Taking a Group Inventory" guideline has been revised and is posted with other guidelines on the Members' Website.

On the homepage of the site, there is a link to order the 2011 World Service Conference Summary, as well as information on our podcasts, multiple blogs, and Together Empowering AI-Anon Members (TEAM) information. WSO is also in the process of electronically archiving all issues of the Conference Summaries.

The Members' site will be updated in the near future. However, there continues to be pertinent information to

meet our members' needs. Please visit the site yourself, and remind other members to visit the site. The members' site can be reached too at: www.al-anon.org/members. Then type in your group's name followed by afg.

The Forum:

As mentioned in a previous report, *Forum* subscriptions have declined over the last few months. Please remember to use *The Forum* in your meetings, and remind your GR's to talk about *The Forum* in their meetings. We are reminded that *The Forum* is not a "meeting in our pocket" to be read in isolation, but our AI-Anon magazine written by members for members in "Sharing Recovery, Unity, and Service."

Finance Report:

Since we will soon start the new panel, I wanted to share again with you information regarding the cost to service each group per year. **It costs WSO \$238.23 per group per year to service, and that WSO provides an equivalent amount to all groups. The average group contribution per group per year is \$104.04, with 57.98% of the groups contributing to WSO.** On pgs. 127-128 of the World Service Handbook in the Service Manual, it lists what is covered in those services to groups, (ie. What the World Service Office does). Twenty separate items are listed so please take a look.

Fellowship vs. Organization:

At the 2011 World Service Conference, and then again at our first TEAM event in May, we were given a presentation demonstrating the difference between AI-Anon the organization, which Lois W. incorporated as AI-Anon Family Groups Headquarters Inc. in 1954, and AI-Anon Family Groups, the fellowship. Since they work together but perform separate functions, I wanted to list some of the differences as noted in the 2011 Conference Summary:

"AI-Anon Family Groups Headquarters Inc., the Organization:

- exists in the eyes of the law
- the Board of Trustees is legally responsible for AFG, Inc.
- has tax exempt status
- is the legal arms/protects our logo, our copyrights, our name
- conducts the business of AI-Anon
- has a governance of the document, "the bylaws of the Corporation," which is amended by the Board of Trustees
- recognizes the World Service Conference as the ultimate Traditional author-

ity.

AI-Anon Family Groups, the Fellowship:

- doesn't exist in the eyes of the law
- doesn't have tax-exempt status
- is the Traditional arm/provides meetings in the service structure
- provides support for individual members
- has a governance document called the "World Service Conference Charter," which is amended by the World Service Conference
- recognizes the Board of Trustees as the chief service arm of the Conference.

Trustee At Large Resume:

While the Trustee At Large (TAL) process is almost complete for this year, please remember to be thinking about members you know who might be qualified and able to serve in this capacity. Trustees At Large are sought every year, and as the Concept 9 text states, it's all of our responsibilities to find qualified members as potential service leaders. Please keep your eyes and ears open over the next year. The requirements to be a Trustee include the following criteria:

"Delegates to the World Service Conference are not eligible to be candidates for Trustee until two (2) World Service Conferences have elapsed after their term as Delegate ends.

A **Trustee at Large (TAL)** can live anywhere within the World Service Conference (WSC) structure. **If chosen to serve as a Trustee, I agree to abide by the following:**

- I understand that serving as a Trustee requires more than just a "willingness to serve."
- I am an active member of AI-Anon Family Groups, with at least ten (10) years of continuous membership, and I will continue attending AI-Anon meetings.
- I am not a member of Alcoholics Anonymous (A.A.).
- I must relinquish all AI-Anon service positions beyond the group level during the term of service.
- I will be required to become an AI-Anon Member Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS).
- I will be required to attend Trustee meetings on a quarterly (i.e., January, April, July, and October) or even on a monthly basis. These meetings may range from 28-to-60 days a year, depending on assignments.

- I can be available to the WSO for consultation and on short notice to attend special meetings of the Board of Trustees.
- I will be required to manage my own luggage, and to share a room with another Trustee.
- I am able to speak and write proficiently in the English language.
- I am in good health, and can sit for long periods of time.
- I can devote sufficient time to complete all assignments on Task Forces, Committees, and Work Group projects in a timely manner. I understand these assignments require a computer and will require work between Board meetings, by phone or e-mail, individually, or on a team.
- I will be asked to speak to large groups, both inside and outside of Al-Anon Family Groups.
- I may be asked to travel anywhere in the world on behalf of Al-Anon Family Groups.
- I understand the Board Vision and Mission statements, and will support the Board's group conscience decisions, regardless of my personal opinions."

Chairman of the Board Letter:

The November Chairman of the Board letter can be found on the Members website, however, here are a few snippets:

"As you know, the Conference and the Board has been discussing cultural competency for the past few years. At the Board meeting, we did the exercise that the Conference did with Dr. Jackson last year. The Board chose the three values that we felt were most important in the fellowship—serenity, helping people, and integrity. Next, we examined our policies, our structures, our practices, our behaviors, and our attitudes to determine if the above values were exhibited in these elements of our fellowship. This conversation will continue, as we support and encourage the membership in their desire to reach out to diverse populations using our values and our principles."

"The Conference structure has been a topic at Conferences since 2008, first as part of the Admissions/Handbook Task Force report, and then through two presentations given by two different Thought Forces. At this Board meeting, all of the information that was presented since the beginning was considered as the Board discussed the next steps that might be implemented in decisions about revising or

changing the structure. All of the concerns that were brought forward were taken into account and addressed by the Board. After an in-depth conversation, it was decided that the Board will present ideas at the 2012 Conference that will address the next steps for the Areas."

"After talking with Delegates about the Delist/Do Not Refer issue, we realized that talking points are needed for you to begin this conversation in your Areas. We have a Task Force working to present those talking points to you, so that we can continue to discuss this topic at the 2012 WSC. Once again, it was affirmed that the WSO's role in this discussion is to determine how we can support Area decisions and adhere to our spiritual principles."

"The Board recently went to Vancouver, BC to visit the city and facilities for our next International Convention in 2013. The convention center is beautiful, with its open spaces and windows that overlook the water. It is a walking city, with a welcoming atmosphere, as well as many interesting sites. I hope that you are saving your money to attend and preparing to volunteer your time. Information will be forthcoming in the fall of 2012."

Policy Update:

"The Policy Update, sent each quarter with the Chairman of the Board's letter, informs each Delegate about Policy Committee business, including any pending motions regarding the "Digest of Al-Anon/Alateen Policies." This update provides important information regarding questions and concerns generated by the fellowship. The Delegates share the Area's input on these topics at the World Service Conference (WSC).

The Policy Committee is continuing to review draft language for the "Public Relations" section of the "Digest of Al-Anon/Alateen Policies," as suggested by the 2011 World Service Conference (WSC). The Policy Committee's "Do Not Refer" Thought Force completed the KBDM questions and began preparing a list of principles for discussion at the 2012 WSC. These principles will shape the Conference discussion, and provide a basis for the Delegates to bring this discussion to their Areas.

The Policy Committee's "Dual Member" Thought Force completed the KBDM questions and outlined the

spiritual principles behind the current policy on "Dual Membership in Al-Anon/Alateen and A.A.," on pages 78-79 of the "Digest of Al-Anon/Alateen Policies." A Task Force has been given the charge to clarify the current policy wording, using these spiritual principles.

The Policy Committee's "Memorial Contributions" Thought Force completed the KBDM questions and developed a list of spiritual principles related to Tradition Five. The Thought Force will further explore these principles in light of all the Legacies."

Trustee Visit Feedback:

I sent back to WSO the completed surveys for our visit from the Trustees at our fall assembly. The feedback appeared to be almost all positive, with a few respondents saying it would be better to have the visit at the spring assembly of an election year. I hope for and look forward to North Florida Area's continued relationships to the Board of Trustees and WSO staff.

2013 AL-ANON INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION, VANCOUVER, BRITISH COLUMBIA, CANADA, JULY 5-7.

Does everyone know what's happening in 2013? Following the Board's approval of the 2013 International Convention theme, "Celebrating Worldwide Unity—Al-Anon Family Groups," a logo was designed for the Convention. The logo will be used for stationery, flyers, registration forms, etc. throughout July 2012 – July 2013. Be sure to save your change, and order or renew your passports in plenty of time!

2012 WSC:

As a reminder, the 2012 World Service Conference (WSC) Theme is:

"Our Spiritual Journey—we get as we give"

"Nuestro viaje espiritual—es al dar que recibimos"

"Notre cheminement spirituel—c'est en donnant que nous recevons."

"The Board felt that this theme lends itself to many topics, such as practicing the program, participating in service, being willing to sponsor, etc. Due to the visit to Stepping Stones, it is noted that this year's World Service Conference will be in Stamford, CT." (July 2011 COB letter)

Love Gifts:

Since it's already November, it's not too soon to be thinking in your districts about what you might want to send for love gifts to thank the Panel 50, 51, and 52 Delegates and other Confer-

ence members for their work at the 2012 World Service Conference. Don't forget to remind members to also send our new Delegate mail to enjoy while he's there. It's very special to get mail from your Area when you're at the World Service Conference. Mailing details for mail and love gifts will be available by the February AWSC.

In Closing:

I will close with a few thoughts for you to ponder as we begin Panel 52 in our meetings and as an Area. The first is the question posed at this year's Conference which I shared with you at the last two Assemblies:

What Spiritual benefits do I receive when I give of my resources?

The second comes from our *Just for Today*:

"Just for today I will be unafraid. Especially I will not be afraid to enjoy what is beautiful and to believe that as I give to the world, so the world will give to me."

ALT DELEGATE: TERRY K.

This is my last Legacy report as Alternate Delegate. It's been a learning experience. Learning not only new things but learning that I could do things I didn't think I could do.

So here's my parting gift to North Florida

I'm a History Buff. I'll admit it. But there's a reason for that. I think the steps, traditions and concepts tell us what to do, but they don't tell us why we do it. For that we have to look to our past. There are many good books on AA and Al-Anon history, but only

three that are Conference approved literature. One is no longer in print, so if you can get your hands on one enjoy it! They are *Lois Remembers*, *Many Voices, One Journey* and the out of print *First Steps*.

At each Area World Service Committee meeting and each Assembly I'd ask a trivia question. Here are some of them.

1. "In the story of AA and Al-Anon, there are two Ann's. Who were they, and what was their part in our history?"
2. "What was the name of Al-Anon Family Groups, before we became Al-Anon?"
3. We've all heard that each side of the Al-Anon triangle represents one of our legacies: recovery, unity, and service. Which side is recovery? Which side is unity? Which side is service?
4. "Al-Anon reminds us to place the focus on us. But it suggests there are two things we should do, when it comes to the alcoholic. What are they?"
5. "We know that the Concepts of Service are called the best kept secret in Al-Anon. When were they adopted?"
6. What did our co-founder, Lois W., believe was the highest function of the human being?
7. "What two traditions speak to anonymity and how do they differ?"
8. What was the original name of *The Forum*?
9. In 1993 the list of cities in which to relocate the World Service Office went from 320 to three. Obviously, Virginia Beach was one of them. Name at least one of the other two.

Try your hand at them and then look at the answers AS I FOUND THEM. (My answers may not agree with what you have found!)

And thanks for being you, North Florida.

ANSWERS:

1. Ann Smith was Dr. Bob's wife. She was very active in the early Akron AA fellowship. Ann S. died before the advent of Al-Anon, but she is held in high regard for the work she did with both AAs and the families of AAs.

Ann B. was a friend of Lois and a mem-

ber of a Family Group. She and Lois contacted the original family groups and handled the communications between those early groups. The two women moved the Al-Anon Clearinghouse from Stepping Stones to the "old 24th Street Clubhouse," in New York City.

2. The answer can be found in at least two Al-Anon books: *Lois Remembers* and *First Steps Al-Anon... 35 years of Beginnings*. Both books contain references to "family groups." When AA suggested that the Family Groups start their own fellowship, we took up the name Al-Anon, a contraction of the name Alcoholics Anonymous, but before that the 87 groups that became Al-Anon were known as "AA Family Groups."

3. The answer I have comes from *The Forum*, page 19, September, 1998 (another reason to read *The Forum!*) "'...Which side is which?' is frequently asked. Research in the WSO Archives does not indicate that there is any 'official' assignment of sides!"

4. How many of you got it? We read the answer at almost every meeting where we read either the suggested Preamble to the 12 Steps, or the Traditions. In both cases we are told to "give encouragement and understanding to the alcoholic."

5. "The Conference of 1970 affirmed them as guidelines for our services. ... The 1984 Conference voted that the Twelve Concepts are to be accorded the same stature as the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions." -*Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual 2010-2013*, pg 171.

6. The answer is on page 196 in *Lois Remembers*. "I used to believe *thinking* was the highest function of human beings. The AA experience changed me. I now realize *loving* is our supreme function. The heart precedes the mind."

7. There isn't a simple "name the page and paragraph" answer. Obviously Traditions 11 and 12 are the two traditions that deal the most directly with anonymity.

In 50 words or less: Tradition Eleven deals with anonymity outside the fellowship, the meetings, the sharing

with a sponsor and the like. Nothing ever said in a meeting or person to person should ever be directly quoted, nor should any member be named.

Tradition 12 deals with anonymity inside the fellowship. We are a fellowship of equals. I've got a lot of time in Al-Anon, but in the rooms of Al-Anon, the newcomer, who's there for his or her first meeting is my equal. I can not let matters of politics, religion or social status divert me from placing principals above personality. One of the biggest disservices we perform is to place a member in a special category because of their social, economic or political status. We're all in Al-Anon for the same reason, no matter how important or unimportant we feel we are. You can take this back to your groups. We used to have lots of meeting on Anonymity, but I don't remember many lately.

8. From *Lois Remembers*, pp 173: "in 1949 (Ruth G.) started a small twelve-page magazine called *The Family Forum*." Lois, herself, wrote a publication called simply, *The Newsletter*. In 1954, with Ruth G's permission, they changed the name of The Newsletter to *Al-Anon Family Group Forum*.

9. Dayton, Ohio and/or Tampa, Florida.

LITERATURE: NANCY G.

I just have to ask you – one last time – have you read any good books lately?

Last month District 10 had a day of workshops and invited me. We did a writing workshop and created sharings for *The Forum* and for the new book on intimacy. It was great fun and I'll be looking forward to seeing some of those sharings in print. Be sure to give our new Lit. Coordinator, Di T., an opportunity to come visit your District and speak or present a workshop.

Sales of *Many Voices, One Journey* (B-31) have not been as high as hoped. This is our newest book and joins personal recovery and Al-Anon history. If you don't have your copy yet, it's time. For those of you who would like to share the wealth, there is a workshop format available to use with this book.

A great resource for information, meeting topics, etc., is the Sample Chapter. A Sample Chapter for Conference Approved Literature is posted each quarter on both the Public Outreach site, www.al-anon.org and the Members' site, www.al-anon.org/members. The Sample Chapter for October through December is in *All Our Affairs* (B-15) and the topic is "From Denial to Awareness."

Do you have special needs in order to use the literature? Are there people in your group who do? Did you know the Directory for Special Needs (S-14) is listed in the CAL Catalog and can also be downloaded online.

Excerpts of Answers Given to Questions Asked of World Service Office (for additional information about WSO's

answers, contact your Literature Coordinator)

The pamphlet *A Guide to Alateen Sponsorship* (P-86) has been discontinued. It no longer fit after the requirements were adopted. It is replaced by the Powerpoint from which our Area Alateen Training has been adapted.

WSO was asked if Al-Anon has considered any literature on using the principles with personal finances. The request will be forwarded to the Literature Committee. It was noted that the challenge will be in maintaining Al-Anon's primary purpose.

Sometimes questions arise about using non-cal or AA Big Book references at meetings. Although a longer answer was given to us by WSO, the gist of it is to check your *2010 – 2013 Service Manual* (P24/27) on p. 101. If members are not aware of this policy or do not understand the reasons we have this policy, it is our responsibility to let them know. Delegates have additional information available to them on e-Communities regarding the history of this policy and why it exists. There is also information about this topic in *Many Voices, One Journey* (B-31). Individuals or groups may also want to look at "Why Conference Approved Literature?" (P-35).

Sometimes we hear pages 269-270 of *From Survival to Recovery* referred to as "The Al-Anon Promises." These appear to have been "lifted" from the A.A. promises. Al-Anon does not list anything in our literature as "promises," because the World Service Conference, Al-Anon's largest group conscience, has not designated anything as such. After much thought and thorough discussion, it was the consensus of the Policy Committee that Al-Anon has no "promises." They determined that the passage in

question was not any more or less valid than any other sources of hope in our literature, and that it should not be promoted as "promises" or "gifts." The question has come to the Literature Committee again a couple times since then, and the Committee's response has remained the same.

Remember when addressing any concerns, to "presume goodwill." Most members who refer to "Al-Anon promises" do so without malice or awareness of the larger representative group conscience. Information about this topic is also now included in *Many Voices, One Journey* (B-31), under "Promises" in the index.

5. It appears that I goofed in having the skits and workshops posted on our website. WSO recently told Literature Coordinators that the skits and workshops were given to the Coordinators on e-Communities so they could *coordinate*. "The skits and workshops posted there are intended to motivate members, but it was believed that the motivation would come from seeing the skits or attending the workshops, not from reading them. (It would be the difference between watching a movie about Lois and reading a script for the movie.) They weren't intended for publication, or for every member to read—they were intended for a few people to present to many others."

Also, the Internet is a form of media, and therefore considered a publication. "The skits and workshops often include quotations from CAL. With only a few rare exceptions, the WSO has not been authorized—nor has anyone else—to post CAL on the Internet." We have been asked to keep in mind that "unless your Web site is password protected, anything you post there can be read by an international public audience. Consider which mes-

sages are for the general public and potential members, and which are directed to members."

I will be contacting our web people and Di to see what can be done about making the skits and workshops available appropriately.

Your help is needed. The Literature Committee at WSO (World Service Office) requested and the World Service Conference (WSC) has given conceptual approval for a new book on intimacy in alcoholic relationships. The sharing sheet is now available on the members' website. You can either contribute on-line or download and print it to mail in. I have also given each District Representative (DR) 5 copies.

More sharings are still needed on the Legacy Blogs on the members' website. These are sharings that are posted as blogs now but will be used in a new workbook on our three Legacies – the Steps, Traditions and Concepts.

Always remember . . . Our literature is not just for us, and about us, it's by us. The rest of us need your experience, strength and hope.

INCOMING PANEL 52 TREASURER: CINDY J.

Checking Account Information for NFA AI-Anon Groups

AI-Anon Groups in the North Florida Area have three options:

1. Keep your Group treasury in cash.
2. Open a Consumer Account. Two people from the Group go to a bank and open a Joint Account. Both are able to sign, and if something happens to one, then the other can retrieve the money for the Group. Only requirements: Photo ID.
3. Open a Commercial Account. To do this there is a two step process.
 1. Go to Sunbiz.org and form a "company" under the laws of the State of Florida. There are many options and it does

require certain compliance issues that the Group would have to decide upon, including but not limited to: choosing a type of company, filing Articles of Incorporation, choosing a Registered Agent, paying Filing Fees of \$ 150-1000 depending on the type of Business, application for all local and state Business licenses, and complying with the State of Florida Department of Revenue Tax laws.

2. Go to the Department of Revenue Website and apply for a Tax Exempt number. This will require you to go through the process of fitting in to one of their designated categories. Again, this will depend upon the choices made about the company status. Having the documentation for these two processes will allow a bank in the State of Florida to open a Commercial Bank Account for your Group. *(If your Group chooses this option, be sure that it is done as a Group decision, and that documentation is kept with the Group records and archives.)*

(One thing that our Group investigation found out is that many banks are flexible about fees, and once our needs were explained some banks offered to waive monthly fees. Be sure to look into this in your location.)

Our Traditions suggest that "Groups, as such, ought not be organized..." but each Group is also autonomous so each is free to decide how to proceed. These are the three options that comply with the Laws of the State of Florida. Compliance with the Laws of the State of Florida ensures that your Group is not adversely "affecting another Group, or AI-Anon or AA as a whole."

It is not, under any circumstances, appropriate for your Group to use the FEIN, or State of Florida Tax Exempt Certification of the North Florida Area Assembly for your banking needs. These numbers attach ONLY to the North Florida Area Assembly, AFG, Inc. and are to be used only in conjunction with Area business transactions.

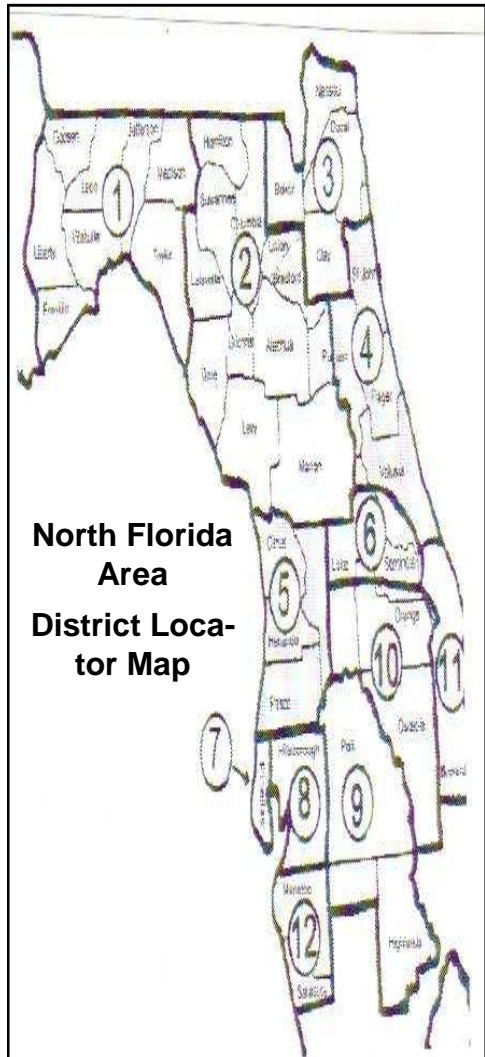
