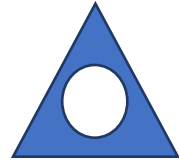

TROLL ALERT

Due to recent, and ongoing, trolling of online meetings, please find the following strategies:

1. Always have a host and a few co-hosts - more eyes to watch out for troll and act quickly to remove him.
2. The Chair should not be Host - this allows them to focus on the actual meeting/sharing.
3. The Chair to state “that due to troll issues, we are asking that all members turn on their cameras and identify”
4. The Chair continues this request throughout the meeting when new members arrive.

Let's use these simple techniques to ensure that our meetings are safe and Al-Anon strong.

Many groups send a member filling in /or elected for the day. This ensures your Group's voice is heard and has a voice and a vote. Also, I know so many of you have fantastic ideas and I would love to hear them.

The links of service are less effective when service positions are not filled; and our **Primary Purpose of helping Families of Alcoholics**, cannot provide enough services to help the families affected by another person's alcoholism.

ARCHIVES

From the Archives...

I have been listening to recordings of Al-Anon meetings held in the Archives. These are usually special meetings such as Group Anniversaries, meetings from Conventions, invited speakers.

The earliest is the 3rd Anniversary meeting of the City Al-Anon Group from 1965. It features shares from people who were responsible for the foundation and expansion of Al-Anon in Victoria. People whose first names are legend in our history. It is so lovely to hear their stories of recovery from themselves. This recording must have been taken on reel-to-reel tape, then probably transferred to cassette and later to CD, and now I am transferring them as digital recordings to the cloud.

Some of the earlier recordings were a little sound compromised but thanks to the Archivist who arranged transfer to CD, we can still hear the wisdom of early members in recovery. Other recordings transferred so far are from Victorian Anniversaries in 1972, 1987 and 1992, and from a Warrnambool meeting in 1982. More to come.

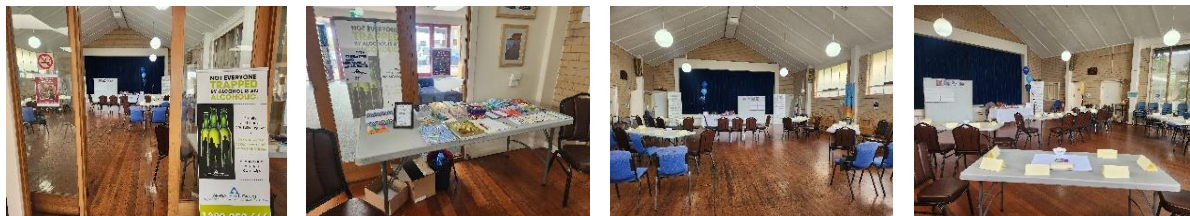
Mornington Spiritual Concept: Attendance numbers 20+ with 3 newcomers lately. They are halfway through their PI Inventory questions.

Next District 1 Hybrid meeting: Monday 18th August.

Our District 1 Public Information Day, held on Friday 30th May at the Frankston Uniting Church, went smoothly with 24 members attending. They found the PI Workshop very informative and rewarding. The intent was to raise awareness of Al-Anon Family Groups in the Peninsula Professional sector and the effects of Alcoholism on the family. Members were also encouraged to attend the workshop to learn more about increasing Public Awareness in their group areas and were also encouraged to invite a professional. A big thank you to Anne S. for her expertise in bringing this whole event together and Louise from Mornington Spiritual Concept meeting for chairing the meeting, making it fun and interesting. Louise has gathered the notes from the Workshop and shared it with members. It will be a valuable PI tool to share in the future. Unfortunately, we didn't have much of a response from the

professionals that were invited. The feedback we did get was they were very keen to learn about our fellowship and will be sharing our message to other colleagues. Very interested also in having Al-Anon speakers attend their facility on a regular basis, to help those that have been affected by this disease. We were not discouraged from the lack of attendance on the day, knowing that the literature sent out will make its way to those in need and help spread the word of Al-Anon. Although there were no literature sales on the day, \$175 was collected from the donations.
